New Terminal One Curtain Wall (South Headhouse)

Terminal 1 - South Terminal Development

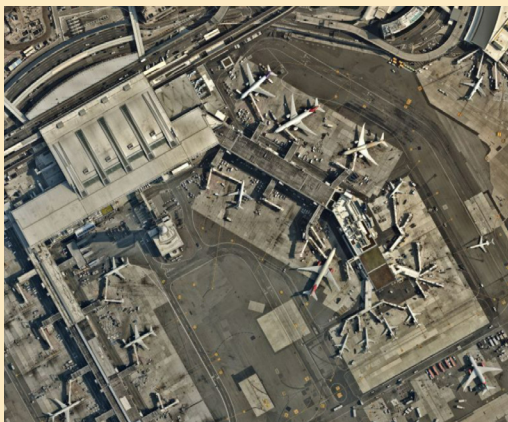
- Completed curtain wall on south face of Headhouse.
- Progress is being made with concrete pours and utility work around the terminal. The north face curtain wall installation is in progress as well.
- Poured concrete for last remaining pier cap for future elevated roadways.
- Continued installation of steel erection and pier foundation for East pier Terminal 4 Concourse A & B.



NTO, Gate 9 - Escalator Install

Terminal 4 - Headhouse and Concourse A Expansion

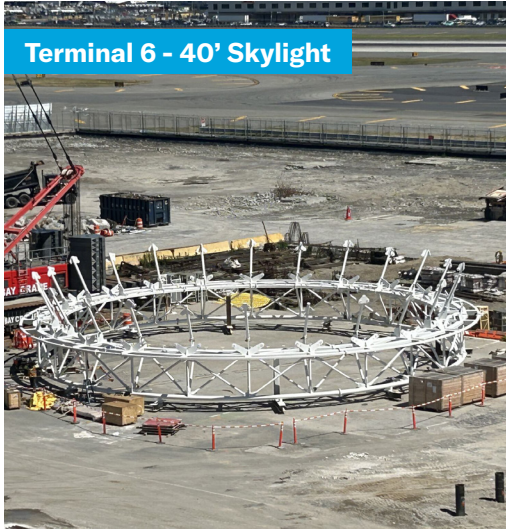
- Completed Gate A8, substation and Stair N for Concourse A.
- Completed Gate 55 and 47 waiting areas.
- Completed renovations for Departures Level Check-In rows 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 for transformation and all three phases of restroom renovations. Artwork is being installed in the restrooms as renovations continue.
- Completed west retail hall construction and continue construction at east retail hall.

Terminal 6 - North Terminal Development

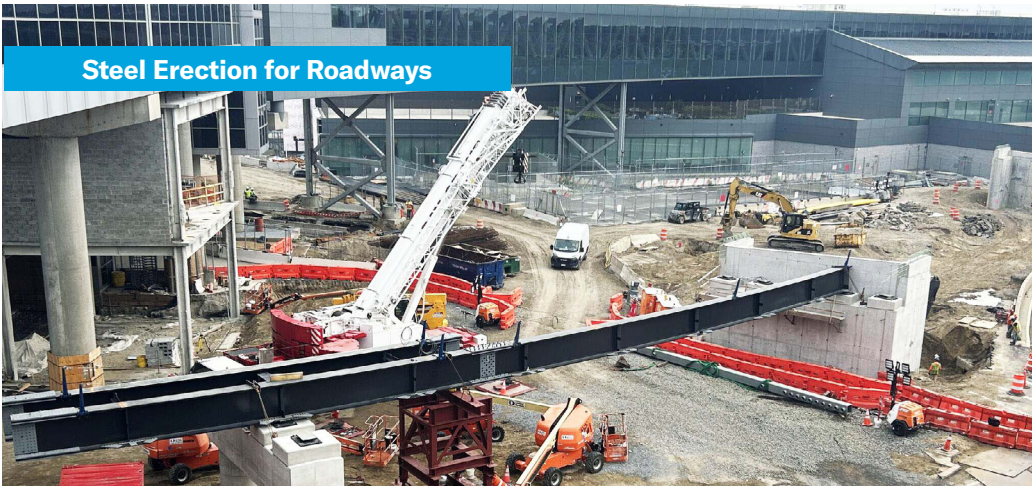


Terminal 6 - 40' Skylight

- Installation of the south-side curtain wall has been completed.
- Pile driving for East Concourse continues.
- Progress has been made with steel erection, detailing, prepping for mechanical, electrical and plumbing installation, roofing install, interior wall stud wall layout, Baggage Handling System install and curtain wall installation.
- Continued mechanical, electrical and plumbing installation: HVAC, fireproofing, and substation testing



Steel Erection for Roadways

The first beams of steel for new JFK Terminal 6 roadways went up at the end of July.

Once complete, there will be 2.6 miles of new roadway, including one of the longest departure curbs at JFK.

For-Hire Vehicle (FHV) Changes for Terminal 4 Arriving Customers

To significantly reduce traffic congestion at Terminal 4's frontage, the Port Authority is opening a remote for-hire vehicle (FHV) pickup lot for arriving passengers using services like Uber and Lyft. The remote pick-up lot will be open from noon to 2 a.m. each day. Continuous free shuttle bus service to the remote lot with an abundance of buses will provide service from Terminal 4 every 1 to 2 minutes. Departing passengers who take for-hire vehicles to Terminal 4 will contin-

ue to be dropped off in front of Terminal 4. Taxis will continue to be available on the frontage for arriving passengers at all hours. Modeled after a successful strategy implemented during the redevelopment of LaGuardia Airport, the lot is situated next to the for-hire driver/vehicle waiting lot, which will enable speedier pickups and easier access to the Van Wyck Expressway and Belt Parkway. Overall, passengers will save time relative to the delays they would

face exiting heavily congested terminal frontage, as was demonstrated during the redevelopment of LaGuardia. The remote FHV pickup lot is expected to divert as many as 13,000 vehicles from the terminal frontage every day and allow for easier access to highways off the airport. In addition to Terminal 4 customers, arriving Terminal 5 customers have been using a remote pick-up lot at the Orange Lot, accessed via AirTrain JFK, since June 2023.

Bridge Demolition Continues To Make Way For Future Simplified Roadway Network



RUGTC - Former Green Garage

The Ground Transportation Center (GTC) will provide multi-level parking for approximately 2,000 vehicles to replace the existing Green Garage and surface lot parking. The new transportation center will bridge to New Terminal One and provide at-

grade access to existing Terminal 4. The GTC will include technology features to enhance efficiency, including automated entry, electric vehicle charging stations, and a wayfinding system to direct drivers to available parking. The GTC is also part of the

largest Design-Build project that the Port Authority is undertaking, which also includes the roadways and utilities. This project has been awarded to the joint venture of Skanska, a leading global construction and development firm, and Halmar International LLC.

Central Substation 2

- Work has progressed on the installation of carpentry work in bathrooms, as well as the installation of fire sprinklers and ductwork for exhaust fans.
- Energization of high-volt switchboard to provide substation house power sometime this August.
- Testing of equipment starting in August.
- Anticipated energization of first set of switchgear equipment in October 2024 with all switchgear being energized by end of year.

Restaurant Associates and Union Square Events have collaborated to elevate the culinary experience in the Delta One Lounge, with dishes such as Hamachi crudo, steak tartare and lasagna bolognese. There is a designated wellness area, equipped

with nine reservable relaxation pods with full-body massage chairs and nap chairs, treatments from Grown Alchemist certified therapists, and more.

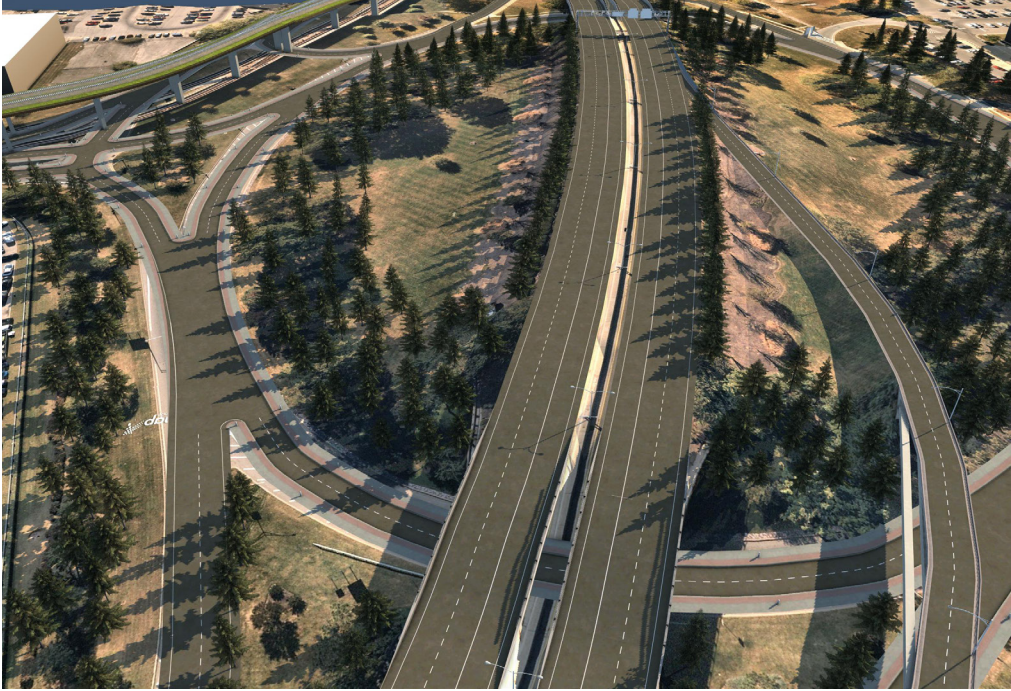

Federal Circle | Ongoing work & Capacity Improvements

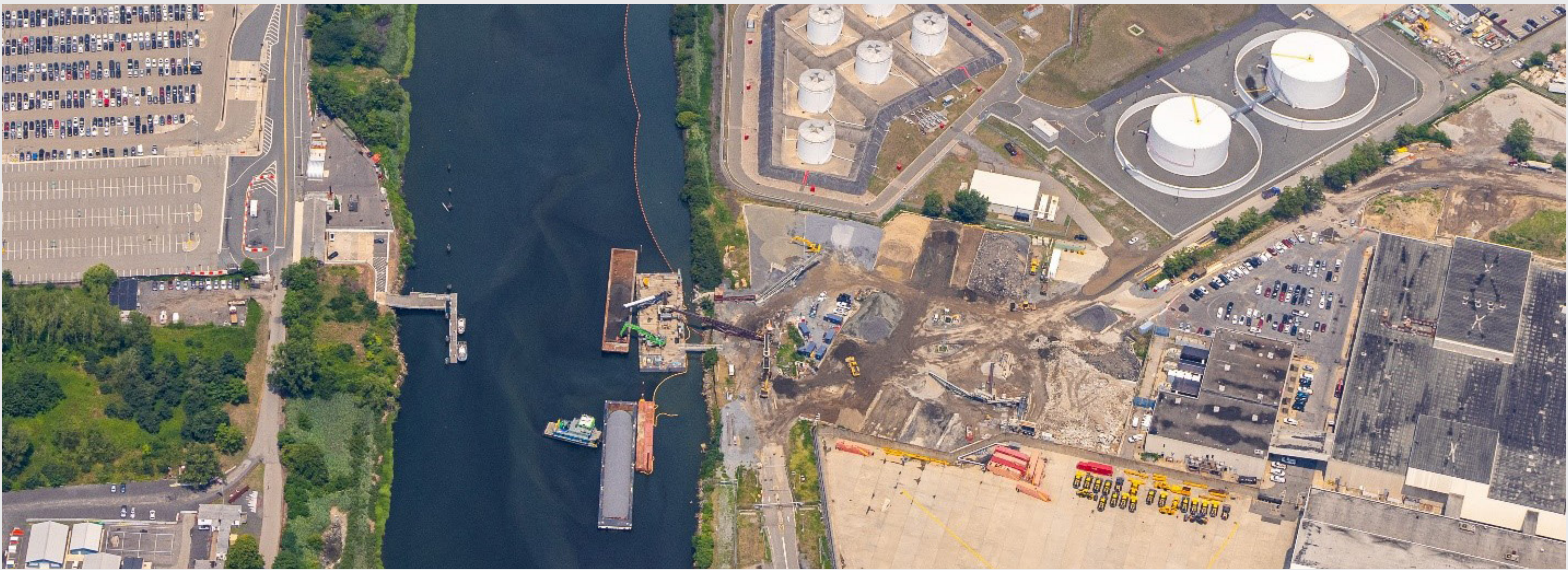


Federal Circle is very busy at the moment with a combination of enabling works and capacity improvements.

The NYSDOT contractor is in the process of relocating communication manholes to enable the widening of the northern Federal Circle crossing.

The JFKR Westbound Connector contractor is finalizing the piling and earthworks for the construction of the new Westbound Connector tie-in.

The configuration and traffic lights on Federal Circle are being optimized to increase capacity for diverted New Terminal One traffic.
